CELEBRATING A MUSICAL LEGACY

The Hickory Choral Society's October 20 Fall Concert with guest conductor Dr. André Thomas (see last page) will provide an opportunity to live out all three dimensions of the mission above and do so in exciting and unprecedented ways! The performance will surely be transformative, as the audience will experience HCS singers and an orchestra performing music composed and conducted by one of the most celebrated choral musicians of our time. André Thomas. The centerpiece of the concert will be a performance of Thomas's multi-movement work, Mass: A Celebration of Love and Joy. Dr. Jason Dungee, Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Choral activities at UNC-Charlotte, will serve as the tenor soloist. He performed on the London (U.K.) Symphony's premiere of the work under Thomas's direction in 2022. Lenoir-Rhyne University graduate and Hickory's own LaKeisha Ross-Johnson will serve as the soprano soloist. Inspired by the traditional Latin texts of the Roman Mass, the music is in the gospel style and accompanied by a full orchestra. The first half of the program will include shorter selections by Thomas, including his beloved arrangement of the African American Spiritual "Keep Your Lamps", a staple of the choral repertoire found in libraries across the country.

HCS support of music education will also be a visible element of the fall concert. A select choir of 40 singers from 10 area high schools, the Lenoir-Rhyne Youth Chorus, and singers from Lenoir-Rhyne University, Caldwell Community College and TI, and



Catawba Valley Community College will all participate. Through his work as a festival conductor around the country and world, André Thomas has inspired thousands of young singers to love the choral art, and we are fortunate that this performance will provide area students with a choral experience they will remember for the rest of their lives.

Finally, we again find ourselves in another highly divisive and polarized election season. The fall concert will seek to challenge barriers to social harmony, including age, political differences, campus/town and rural/urban divisions, race. ethnicity, status, gender, and more, as hundreds of people join together for the common goal of making transformative music performance as a single ensemble. The power of music will be on full display as the Hickory Choral Society and a large cross section of the region's choral community performs under the baton of quest conductor André Thomas. An effort of this magnitude that helps us live out our mission in such a meaningful way would not be possible without your support. Thank you! We hope to see you in Lenoir-Rhyne's P.E. Monroe Auditorium on October 20!



Spotlight: 2024 Children's Choral Camp

What do you get when you combine African drumming, abstract painting, an exploration with dinosaurs, singing, choreography, a visit from "Grandma", and snacks? You get a fun week at the Hickory Choral Society's Children's Music Camp. Our annual music camp was a blast and the smiles on the campers' faces were proof.



The week was filled with singing each day with Mrs. Sarah Luhrs. Clinicians for the choral camp are selected for their vast experience of teaching music to youngsters and Mrs. Sarah Luhrs definitely surpassed that expectation. For five days, the campers had the incredible opportunity to learn selections of choral music, specifically composed for young voices. Sarah Luhrs holds a B.M. and an M.A.M.E in music education from St. Olaf College and University of St. Thomas, respectively. She taught elementary general music for several years in Minnesota and Florida. Since moving to North Carolina, she has worked with local church choirs. This summer, she will graduate this summer with a degree in clinical mental health counseling. In her free time, Sarah loves to read and play card games with her family.

André Thomas


Fall HCS concert quest conductor is a Professor Emeritus of Music at Florida State University. He was visiting Professor of Choral Conducting at Yale University from 2020-2022. He also served as a faculty member at the University of Texas, Austin. He is presently an Associate Artist with the London Symphony Orchestra.

Dr. Thomas received his degrees from Friends University (B.A.), Northwestern University (M. M.), and The University of Illinois (D.M.A). He is in demand as a choral adjudicator, clinician, and director of Honor/All-State Choirs throughout North America, Europe, Asia, New Zealand, Australia, and Africa, Dr. Thomas has conducted choirs at the state, division, and national conventions of the Music Educators National Conference (NAFME) and the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA).

His international conducting credits are extensive. He has led numerous prestigious orchestras and choirs around the world, including the Birmingham Symphony Orchestra in England, the Berlin Radio Choir and the North German Radio Choir in Germany, the Netherlands Radio Choir, the Bulgarian Radio Choir & Orchestra, the Seoul Metropolitan Chorus, Ansan City Choir, Jeju

Provincial Seogwipo Chorale in South Korea. the Charlotte Symphony, China's People's Liberation Orchestra. the Czech National Symphony Orchestra. and the London Symphony

Orchestra.



Thomas is a distinguished composer/arranger with Hinshaw Music Company, Mark Foster Music Company, Fitzsimons Music Company, Lawson Gould, Earthsongs, Choristers Guild, and Heritage Music Company.


Various musical organizations have recognized Thomas with the Living Legend Award, the Distinguished Service Award, the Robert Shaw Award, the NCCO (National Collegiate Choral Organization) Lifetime Achievement Award, and the Southern Region of ACDA Award of Excellence. In January 2019, he was inducted into the Florida Music Educator's Hall of Fame, and in 2022 he was presented the Samuel Simons Sanford Medal, the most prestigious honor conferred by the Yale School of Music.
