An Irish Afternoon in County Catawba

We may not have a massive parade in downtown Hickory or have plans to dye the Catawba River green this coming St. Patrick's Day weekend. Yet, our region will have the opportunity to celebrate Celtic heritage as HCS offers a March 17 all-Irish program for our Spring Concert at First Baptist Church in Hickory. The concert will be guest conducted by Dr. Anne Barry, Director of Choral Activities and Associate Professor of Music at Lake Forest College in Chicago. Hailing originally from Waterford, Ireland, Barry has conducted choirs throughout the United States, Europe, New Zealand, and the United Arab Emirates. Her Irish folksong arrangements have been published by Earthsongs and Cailíno Music Publishers.



Waterford, Ireland

The concert will feature traditional Irish tunes such as "Siúil A Rúin", "Dilín Ó Deamhas", "I'll Tell Me Ma", and "On Raglan Road". Composers Michael McGlynn, Eoin Conway, Greg Scanlon, Fintan O'Carroll, Su Furlong, Marion Ingoldsby, Ben Hanlon, Eric Sweeney, and Barry will all be represented. The concert's finale, Come the Sails, is a multi-movement work for choir and orchestra that was commissioned to honor Waterford, Ireland's oldest city, and Barry's hometown. Founded in 914CE by Vikings, the important port city sits on the confluence of the River Barrow and River Suir just before they spill into the Atlantic Ocean. The texts and music of the work highlight the history of this fascinating city! In addition to choral music, this concert will also feature a set by Harpa, a Celtic harp ensemble that has performed throughout North Carolina, Norway, Sweden, and Scotland. Former HCS singer Martha Hill performs with this group.



Want to learn more about Irish heritage? Dr. Barry will lead a session on Irish culture, music, and dance the day prior to the concert, **Saturday, March 16, 3pm in the Don Coleman Rehearsal Hall at the SALT Block.** The event is free and open to the public.

One discovery that I made shortly after joining the group was just how mentally healthy this is for me! I knew that it would be a commitment , and I thought that it might be stressful, but singing in the choral society has become the highlight of my week each and every week. What we do is so uplifting, so much fun, and I've made lots of wonderful new friends that I look forward to seeing every week!

Another discovery that I made was at the end of our 2023 Fall Concert titled "Love and Music Endure." We worked for a

few months to learn Robert Cohen's "Alzheimer Stories," which we performed during the latter half of this concert. I learned so much about Alzheimer's disease that I didn't know before. I thought we were definitely going to minister to lots of people through this piece of music, and we did!



I've had so many people come up to me and express how much they were blessed by this music and story, how less alone they feel, how much more they now know. But the real discovery I made was upon completing "Alzheimer Stories" as I looked up at our conductor and the other singers standing all around me. This music and this story had ministered to us! The solidarity was evident between us all, and the love for music endured and enhanced. The ministry of music and all the emotion it invokes was present in the hearts and apparent on the faces of all of us! It moved each and every person who was present, and I knew this was inevitable, but I learned that this is a ministry to all - even those of us who are learning and singing this music! Music unites us all. It is ever necessary in this world!

My experience in my first year of becoming a singer for the Hickory Choral Society is truly one of the best years I've lived. It reminds me how important it is to embrace passion, and it has reminded of how important it is to pursue passion alongside other like-minded people. We find community, we find solidarity, we find ourselves, and we find that love and music will endure, and we can learn so much from it.

EDUCATION MATTERS 2023-24 Music Education Grants

Each fall, HCS invites public school music educators in our area to apply for grants from the J. Don Coleman Education Fund. Knowing that most public schools work with very limited funding for the arts, grant money is awarded specifically for the purchase of music related to projects or performances for the current school year. This will then help schools build a library of music that can be used for years to come.

In December, we were thrilled to award 13 different grants for a total of \$5,000. Grant recipients represented all four of our participating counties, and at least one from every qualifying school system (county and city). Those who were able joined us to be recognized in person at one of our Christmas concerts.

The J. Don Coleman Education Fund was established in 1984 to honor the Hickory Choral Society's founding conductor and help promote and expand choral music in Catawba County public school systems. The program has since been expanded to include public schools in Burke, Caldwell, and Alexander counties, and it directly aligns with the second goal in our mission statement which is the *support of music education*.
